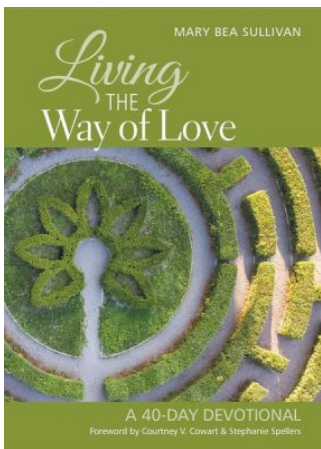

<p><b>SERVICE I</b> March 10, 2019 Church of the Ascension</p> <p><b>The Reverend Jacquelyn Rowe</b></p> <p>The Reverend Jacquelyn Rowe, graduated from the General Theological Seminary class of 1998. She was ordained in the Episcopal Diocese of Southeast Florida. Her ordination followed a 24 year career in Miami-Dade County Government where, as a member of Leadership Miami Class of 1994, she was awarded for work with Haitian Immigrants, Firefighters, Civil Rights, and Cultural Arts. Most recently, she is the retired Rector of St. Thomas Episcopal Church in Red Bank, New Jersey. Mother Jaclyn has participated in outreach and evangelism missions in Tanzania, Uganda, Kenya, and South Africa. She has served as a National Disaster Chaplain, and on Crisis &amp; Response teams in Southeast Florida, Central Gulf Coast, New York, and New Jersey.</p>	<p><b>SERVICE II</b> March 17, 2019 Church of the Resurrection "Jazz Mass"</p> <p><b>The Reverend Dr. Richard Tolliver</b></p> <p>The Rev. Dr. Richard L. Tolliver has four earned degrees, including a Ph.D. from Howard University and is a graduate of The Advanced Management Development Program (AMDP) in Real Estate at the Harvard University Graduate School of Design. He has served parishes in Harlem, Boston, Washington, D.C., and retired as rector of St. Edmund's Church, Chicago, on June 30, 2017 after twenty-eight years. In March 1990, Dr. Tolliver founded the St. Edmund's Redevelopment Corporation (SERC), a not-for-profit community development corporation devoted to revitalizing the housing stock of Chicago's Washington Park neighborhood. To date, SERC has constructed or renovated over 734 units of housing located in 31 buildings at a cost of over \$30 million. In March 2011, then Mayor-elect Rahm Emanuel appointed Dr. Tolliver</p>	<p>to his transition Team where he served on the Transportation and Infrastructure Committee. He was also appointed to the Commission on Chicago Landmarks, the Low Income Housing Trust Fund and the Chicago Development Fund (CDF), a non-profit affiliate of the City of Chicago that invests in Chicago communities using New Markets Tax Credit financing. Tolliver is also a board member of the Beverly Bank and Trust Company, owned by Wintrust Corporation, which has assets of over \$11 billion dollars. He has served on numerous diocesan, National Episcopal Church commissions, civic and corporate boards.</p>	<p><b>SERVICE III</b> March 24, 2019 Church of the Holy Family "Reverie"</p> <p><b>The Reverend Danielle Pontiff</b></p> <p>The Reverend Danielle Pontiff is a multifaceted, dynamic, young, ordained Deacon in the twin island Republic of Trinidad and Tobago. At the age of 20, she began volunteering at the Trinidad and Tobago Cancer Society, to teach in both rural communities and corporate settings about this preventable disease. At 33, her spiritual journey led her to test her vocation at Colby College (Anglican Seminary) where she was awarded her Certificate in Pastoral Care, Grief Counseling, and HIV &amp; AIDS counseling. Danielle holds Associate and Bachelor Degrees in Business Management. She is a proud entrepreneur owning two businesses. Danielle also holds a full time position as the Central Statistical Office, a division of the Ministry of Planning and Development.</p>	<p><b>SERVICE IV</b> March 31, 2019 Trinity Cathedral</p> <p><b>Everett B. Ward Ph.D.</b></p> <p>Dr. Everett B. Ward is the 11th president of Saint Augustine's University and the 3rd alumnus to serve in St. Augustine's 151-year history. Prior to returning to his alma mater, Dr. Ward was the director of the Historically Black Colleges and University (HBCU) Minority Institutions of Higher Education (MIHE) Program for the North Carolina Department of</p>	<p>Transportation (NCDOT). In July 2016, Dr. Ward was elected as the 30th General President of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. where he is also a life member. He also holds membership in Sigma Phi Epsilon Fraternity (The Brotherhood) and the 100 Black Men, Inc. Dr. Ward is a lifelong member of Davis Street Presbyterian Church, USA where he is a Ruling Elder. Dr. Ward earned his BA from Saint Augustine's College, his MA degree from North Carolina State University (NCSU), and his PhD from North Carolina Agricultural and Technical (A&amp;T) State University.</p>
